Joy Gunderson began playing harp at weddings at age 9. She has toured and given concerts in 40 of the 50 states. She is a voice major as well. At St. Olaf College, she earned the highest academic and music scholarships. She had the honor of being chosen to be the St. Olaf Orchestra harpist in her freshmen year. Karin Gunderson is a music graduate of Concordia College. Karin has developed a wide repertoire from classical to popular love songs, Christian music to Latin American, Celtic, and country and western.



James Schlender, violin & Craig Hall, acoustic guitar

James Schlender is a young violinist who attends the University of Miami, studying jazz and classical violin. He started playing the fiddle when he was 9 years old, and by the time he was 13, he had won 2 National Fiddle Championships. Since that time he has placed in the top 10 for the last 3 years in the prestigious Grandmasters Fiddle Contest held in Nashville.

Craig Hall, a native of Montana, is a jazz guitarist and acoustic bassist who has carved out an existence as the definitive sideman of the upper mountain states. He has played in recent years in over 30 states and on four continents with a diverse array of groups from the Montana Mandolin Society to Eden Atwood groups, the Jeni Fleming Trio and others.



Eden Atwood and Friends

Eden Atwood began singing jazz in Memphis, TN, at Shakey's Pizza Parlor at age three. Singing jazz came naturally to her. Her father, Hub Atwood, was a writer and arranger for the likes of Frank Sinatra, Harry James, Stan Kenton and Nat King Cole. When Eden was five years old, she moved to Montana with her mother, the daughter of Pulitzer Prize winning author, A.B. Guthrie Jr. Her mother kept her love of music alive by encouraging her participation in musicals.

classical piano had provided her with a solid musical foundation but she wanted to write and arrange her own material. She produced a demo tape that caught the attention of Bill Allen at Chicago's legendary, now defunct, Gold Star Sardine Bar. At 21, she became the headliner. In 1992, Eden was tapped for a role on ABC's, "The Commish" and she starred for nine months on the ABC daytime drama, "LOVING."



At 15, she was fronting a band of musicians twice her age in her hometown. She left two years later to attend the University of Montana's drama department. At 19, following her father's death, she set out for Chicago. There she attended the American Conservatory of Music. Eight years of

In 1993, Marian McPartland of Piano Jazz fame heard Eden's self-produced CD, "Today," and forwarded it to Concord Records President, Carl Jefferson. He signed her to a three record deal. She remains the youngest artist ever signed to the Concord label. She now makes her home in Missoula teaching private vocal students, working with attachment disordered children and touring.

The Werner Chamber Ensemble

Young musicians Andree, Mariel, Lucien, and Helene Werner are siblings in the Werner Quartet. When not in Montana, they are often traveling around the globe making music. They have been received enthusiastically at Montana State University's Guest Artist and President's Fine Arts Series, by the Music Guild Series in Los Angeles, on National Public Radio's highly acclaimed program "From the Top," and as soloists with the Bozeman, Billings, and Great Falls Symphony Orchestras. In 2012 they performed at Carnegie Hall in New York. During the summers, the quartet studies and performs at festivals abroad, including Peter de Grote Festival, La Ferme de

Villefavard, and the Congress de Luthiers in France. When the Werner Quartet is at home, you can find them putting their musical talents to work for good causes, including the Rescue Mission for the Homeless and the Wyoming Girls School. They share their music in support of the arts and education, and especially for organizations that encourage opportunities for young musicians. They entertained and amazed us in 2004, 2007, and 2012
