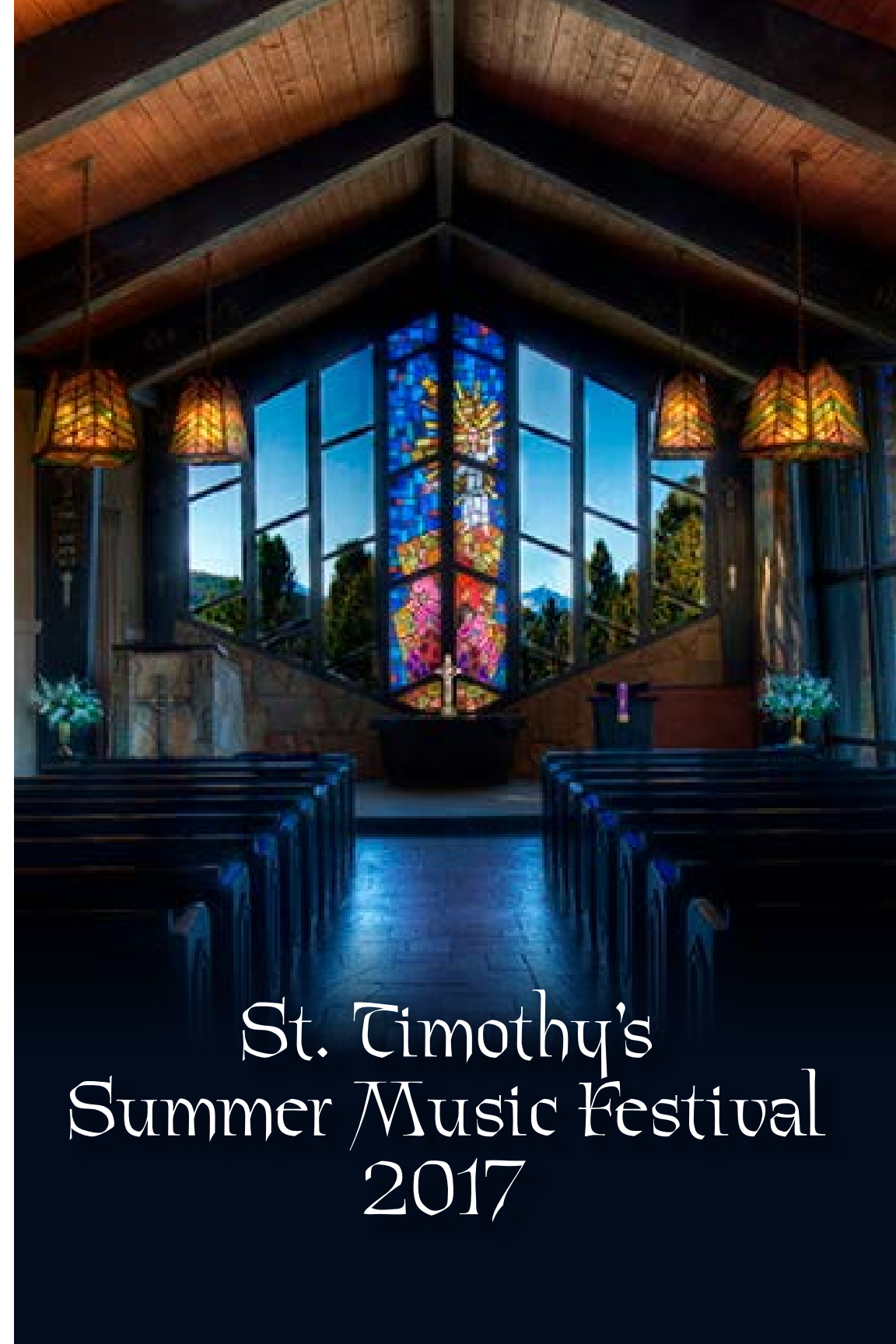

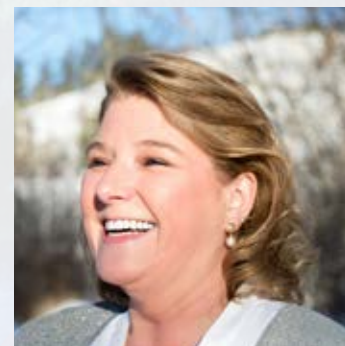


Karen Herrin
